The Oxford dictionary defines 'University' as a high-level educational institution

India's higher education system works at both private and public level universities. Public universities function under the directives issued by the Government

of India and the state governments whereas private universities function under various approved educational bodies and societies. The University Grants Commission (UGC), the highest educational authority, recognizes and awards the 'universal' status to various universities. The UGC draws its power from the University Grants Commission Act, 1956. Along with the UGC, 15 Professional Councils are also established, in charge of different parts of accreditation and coordination.

Govt to push e-education with 4 digital initiatives

Union government has invited nearly 1,000 vice-chancellors of central, state, deemed and private universities and directors of premier institutes such as Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs) and Indian Institutes of Technology (IITs) for the launch of four major digital initiatives in higher education on Guru Purnima on Sunday.

President Pranab Mukherjee will launch

- Swayam — an indigenously designed massive open online course (MOOC)
- Swayam Prabha — 32 Direct-to-Home channels for transmitting high-quality educational content,
- National Digital Library containing 6.5 million books,

- National Academic Depository for authenticating all certificates issued by institutions

UGC bans distance education in non-university institutes

In a watershed decision, the University Grants Commission (UGC) has stated that only universities can offer distance learning programmes in India. With the earlier decision of the Distance Education Council overturned, standalone institutes can no longer continue to run programmes via distance mode.

Across the country dozens of B-schools are raking in crores by offering diploma management courses via distance education. They will all have to cease operations as the UGC will not extend their recognition.

The decision was notified in the last week of June in a UGC gazette notification: The minimum standards of instructions for the grant of first degree through non-formal distance education in the faculties of arts, humanities, fine arts, music, social science, commerce and science.

Assessment of Institutions Goes Digital - Now, students will have a say in accreditation of varsities

Like universities abroad, students in India will now have a say in assessment and accreditation of their institutions. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), which launched its new methodology for grading universities, will give 20% weightage to online student satisfaction survey while offering accreditation from this year.

According to sources, NAAC's SSS will carry 20% weightage during the assessment and grading. Institutions will have to provide email IDs of students and an online survey will be conducted. "The online survey will be done in the second stage of the assessment," said Virander Singh Chauhan, Chairperson of University Grants Commission (UGC).

NSE & BSE in new turf war over academic depository

The government has announced digitisation of all academic certificates awarded by universities and institutes to minimise time constraint in verifying their genuineness. The NAD is an online store house of all academic awards -- certificates, diplomas, degrees, mark-sheets etc. duly digitised and lodged by academic institutions and boards. NAD ensures easy access to and retrieval of an award and validates and guarantees its authenticity and safe storage, according to a statement by CVL. Maintaining academic awards in an electronic depository would provide benefit to educational institutions, students and employers by enabling online access of academic awards which will eliminate the need for persons to approach educational institutions for obtaining transcripts of such awards or marks-sheets for verification, CVL said.

No GST on books, but prices set to rise

No input tax credit available to publishers

Book lovers and students will now have to pay more as books will become costlier by 10-20 per cent under the Goods and Services Tax regime.

Though books continue to remain exempt under GST, but inputs such as printing, binding and royalties to authors now attract tax at 12 per cent. Since the publishers don't get input tax credit, they now propose to pass it on to customers.

"Books are not taxable under GST, but we are at a disadvantage as we lose out on input tax credit. Prices of books will increase by 15 per cent to 20 per cent," said Amit Bhargava, Director of Taxmann.
