KJ Choksi Public Library installs DG sets for a 24/7 power supply

Education has been widely at stake during the pandemic. However, the improving situation of COVID has now started making the students sincere in the exam preparations, especially competitive exams. K J Choksi Public Library's reading room is helping a lot of children prepare for competitive exams and is always 100% occupied.

Power cut-outs in the city sometimes make studies a bit challenging, making it uneasy for the students to concentrate on their studies. A power cut just before the exam would demoralise a student and also put him/her to a huge disadvantage.

As soon as the impact due to powercut on studies got noticed by the Project Director of the Library, Mr Manan Choksi, he immediately made a decision to install DG sets in the library and soon the decision got into action. Students may not have power back up at home and with power outages common a 24/7 reading room facility would help improve academic results.

The library - largest and most wellequipped fully AC reading room in Bharuch, installed DG sets, so readers pose no disruption in studying due to power cut at all and use the library 24/7. This was done as the city of Bharuchhas a lot of power cuts, making it difficult for the students to excel at exams.

About KJ Choksi Library

K J Choksi Public Library is the memorial of Late Shri Kantilal Jaikishandas Choksi, a freedom

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Fighter and the Mayor of Bharuch City. The library is a non-profit set-up, fully funded by Kantilal J Choksi Charitable Trust. The motto behind setting up the library was to develop reading habits among the people.



The library holds a collection of over 45000 books available in different languages such as Gujarati, English, Hindi, as well as Marathi. It has an average of over 30,000 readers per year who take advantage of the same.

The library has always made sure to provide the best to its readers – be it providing a comfortable airconditioned seating place, clean drinking water facilities, safety & security systems or choice of thousands of books, either for reading pleasure or to prepare for competitive exams.

The tale of two libraries

Connemara is one of the four national depository libraries in India; Anna is one of the biggest in south Asia

After a parliamentary career of 18 years in Britain, Robert Bourke (1827-1902), later Baron Connemara, became Governor of the Madras Presidency in 1886.



Unlike many of his predecessors and successors, he interacted freely and cordially with people of all classes. In no time did he develop an admiration for Indian students and realised not many were able to afford the books they needed. As part of his efforts to address this need, he laid the foundation in March 1886 on Pantheon Road in Egmore for, what he called, a "free public library", which later came to be called Connemara Public Library...

Libraries are repositories of knowledge and cultural wisdom. And the librarians of Ukraine have emerged as firm custodians of the nation's heritage and public image.

Since the start of (and even before) the active Russian invasion, librarians of Ukraine have been actively participating in the resistance. Libraries under the Ukrainian Libraries Association (ULA) have been helping civilians and military personnel alike by providing training in home care for the injured and also doubling as temporary asylums for civilians displaced by war. According to statements issued by ULA chief Oksana Bruy in the past few days, the libraries are also at the forefront of defending Ukraine in cyberspace by countering a barrage of misinformation...
