Rural libraries in Karnataka to remain open for eight hours




The state government on Thursday issued an order increasing the daily work hours of gram panchayat libraries from six hours to eight hours while fixing a minimum wage for supervisors working there.

According to the order, the gram panchayat libraries will be renamed as 'Arivu Kendras'. The libraries will remain closed on public holidays, second and fourth Tuesdays and every Monday (weekly off). On the first and third Tuesdays, all Wednesday Thursdays and Fridays, the libraries will be open from 9 am to 1 pm and 3 pm to 7 pm...

Indians spend 194 minutes a day on media platforms like Instagram, Facebook and X



Tech and policy think tank Esya Centre has found that daily engagement in terms of time spent is the highest for social media at 194 minutes a day. This number for OTT and Online Gaming stands at 44 minutes and 46 minutes, respectively, and when it comes to time and use pattern, a median user spends less than Rs 100 a month and less than an hour a day on online gaming while the corresponding number is Rs 200-400 for OTT.

This was part of a report it released titled "New-Age Digital Consumption: A Survey of Social Media, OTT Content and Online Gaming" in which it called India's regulatory landscape more progressive than its peers. "India is moving from a command-and-control model of regulatory oversight to a light touch model for new industries. While technology is dynamic, consumption patterns are more predictable. Therefore, building a profile of a Digital Nagrik and their consumption patterns can form the crux to an agile policy ecosystem for the three sectors. An attempt our report aims to make," Rajat Sharma, Associate Professor, Indian Institute of Management Ahmedabad (IIM-A) said...

Books at high-profile libraries just a click away

Pilot in 13 libraries
