
FROM EDITOR'S DESK:


SADVICHAR PARIVAR DEVELOPMENT NEWSLETTER:

FAQS RELATED TO PURSUING LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES: (M. LIB. I. SC., BLIS, MLIS, DIPLOMA INLIS, CERTIFICATE COURSE IN LIS)

What is Library and Information Science (LIS) profession all about?

Library and Information Science (LIS) is a noble profession which is well accepted and popular in both the developed and developing countries around the globe. Libraries and Information Centres can be considered the backbone of the Academic World and contribute hugely to an informed Society while ensuring industrial advancement, Research, and Development.

What are the advantages of being in LIS profession?

Being in this profession, one gets a lifetime opportunity to work with intellectuals and at the same time endeavor to guide the illinformed in becoming aware of government schemes and programs. It's a pride to claim that Library and Information Science profession provides opportunities to work with all kinds of people in the society. This profession plays a vital role in the nation's development.

Who offers Library and Information Science Degrees in India?

In India, most of the leading state universities, a few central universities, as well as private universities, offer either BLIS or MLIS as standalone oneyear programs or an integrated 2-year M. Lib. I. Sc. Program. Some state universities and colleges do offer a sixmonth Diploma/Certificate course in Information Science Librarv and discipline. Most of the universities which have an established Library and Information Science Department, and permanent faculty members even offer research programs like PhD in LIS, Post-Doctoral Fellowship in LIS, etc.

What is the syllabus for the BLIS, MLIS or MLIBISC programmes offered by the universities?

Most of the universities follow the UGC Curriculum and Credit Framework recommended for designing their syllabus. Knowledge Organization (Classification), Knowledge Processing (Cataloguing), Information Sources and Services, Library Automation, Library Management, Research Methodology, Web Technologies, Information Systems. Information Storage and Retrieval, Scientometrics and Informetrics. Knowledge Management are some of the core courses offered as the curriculum of the LIS academic programs in the universities.

What is the pedagogy and unique features of LIS academic programs?

Internship and Dissertations are part of the two-year integrated master's program along with field trips, theory and practice of the core library and information science subjects with options of choosing electives from relevant disciplines.

How to take admission for the bachelor's and master's Programmes in LIS?

Admission to the LIS academic programs in universities is usually through call for the applications in local newspapers, on the university websites and on social media at the start of the academic year. Along with the online application, the potential candidates need to write an entrance exam.

Who can apply for the bachelor's and master's program in LIS?

Any person holding a bachelor's degree in Arts, Commerce, Science or Engineering stream can apply for these programs.

What are the job opportunities for the

LIS graduates?

Successful completion of one year bachelor's program in LIS helps in securing jobs in schools, colleges, NGOs, etc. It's the two-year integrated M. Lib. I. Sc program that has a wider range of job opportunities right from placed in public libraries, being academic libraries and special libraries at various levels. Entry level begins with a year of traineeship in any type of library of one's choice and goes up the career graph as junior professional assistant, senior professional assistant, assistant librarian, deputy librarian and librarian. Equally, the opportunities of working in the information industry with reputed publishers, technology giants, are plenty. A PhD degree in Library and Information Science with NET & JRF provides scope to pursue teaching at the university level.

What is the social status and salary structure of a LIS professional?

LIS is a multidimensional profession wherein personal and professional development is symbiotic. The societal dimension is that librarianship is a respected profession as government offices, educational institutions and research organizations have a library or a resource centre which hire LIS professionals. They enjoy the status of an officer and are extended all the privileges and perks that are given to the officers working in other sections of the organization. The salary structure of most designations in the library/resource center is decent and a LIS professional can lead an economically comfortable life.

Why should one choose LIS profession over other professional courses?

The intellectual stimulation is quite high in the field of librarianship as the work involves critical and creative thinking as well as problem solving and decisionmaking skills. The emotional stability in the librarianship is high and helps one to well develop interpersonal as as intrapersonal skills resulting in confidence in their work areas. LIS professionals being surrounded by knowledge resources all through will always strive to excel and make a mark in their careers by upskilling themselves in technology, communication and soft skills. LIS is one of the very few professions that ensures the gift of Lifelong Learning.

What are the growth and development opportunities available for LIS Professionals?

Continuous professional development opportunities are in the form of expert talks, workshops, seminars and conferences for the highly motivated professionals. Good number of professional associations at the regional, national and international level give opportunity for the LIS an professionals to network with peers. collaborate and contribute to the growth of the profession.
